#### **Test Valley Community Resilience Forum**

The Test Valley Community Resilience Forum took place on 19 October at King's Somborne Village Hall. The session aimed to build on our current Community Resilience model, focusing



on how we respond to emergencies and what Test Valley Communities require of the Council and other partners in emergency situations. A workshop took place to help identify the specific risks and challenges your local community faces and what level of support might be required from agencies in responding to an emergency. All communities face a variety of risks and challenges and we hope to understand these better to develop true to life scenarios which can test the Council's ability to respond

to emergencies and put appropriate support in place for communities.

#### Could you or a loved one be entitled to Pension Credit?

Pension Credit is a means-tested benefit designed to top up the income of people over State Pension age, if your weekly income is below:

- £218.15 if you are single
- £332.95 if you have a partner

Even if your income is higher, you might still be entitled to claim it if you have a disability or care for someone.

The average Pension Credit award is worth £3,900 per year and unlocks a host of other benefits such as: winter fuel payments, free TV licence (if over 75 years old) and support with rent/mortgage interest and council tax.

Test Valley councillors have come together to support some of the most vulnerable pensioners in the borough who are set to lose their Winter Fuel Allowance following the government's recent decision to limit payments to those receiving means tested benefits.

Councillors showed unanimous support for the proposal to allocate £20,000 to the Test Valley Winter Fuel Payment Scheme, and a further £20,000 if required, to continue support for those of pensionable age in the borough who need assistance with paying their winter bills. Guests were given a talk about Test Valley, which highlighted our approach to working with communities with councillors at the heart of this model, as well as the work of the Hawk Conservancy including a tour of the venue and an Owl flying display.

Councillor Jeffrey also invited Hampshire Civic Heads to join him on a visit to the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Air Ambulance airbase at Thruxton to learn about the work the charity undertakes to help people in emergency situations. HIOWAA is one of the Mayor's chosen charities for his civic year.

The museum may seem an odd place for all things cosmic, but did you know that one of their exhibits has been in space?

The shirt of former Army Air Corps officer, Major Tim Peake, was worn on the International Space Station. During his mission, Tim took part in over 250 experiments, completed a spacewalk to repair the Station's power supply, and ran the London marathon on a treadmill.

## Andover fly-tipper ordered to pay £2,000 after being caught on hidden camera



A man from Andover has been ordered to pay over £2,000 after being spotted flytipping twice, by a hidden camera.

On 9 August 2023, a council officer found a large amount of waste in a disused barn in Charlton, near Andover, including a large

quantity of cardboard boxes and general household waste. Footage from a nearby hidden camera showed a white van at the scene.

Almost two months later, on 30 September 2023, the camera caught the same vehicle entering the barn again, with furniture and toys later found dumped inside.
